WELCOME TO BELGRADE

"The sky above Belgrade is wide and high, unstable but always beautiful; even during winter serenities with their icy splendour; even during summer storms when the whole of it turns into a single gloomy cloud which, driven by the mad wind, carries the rain mixed with the dust of panonian plain; even in spring when it seems that it also blooms, along with the ground; even in autumn when it grows heavy with the autumn stars in swarms. Always beautiful and rich, as a compensation to this strange town for everything that isn't there, and a consolation because of everything that shouldn't be there.



But the greatest splendour of that sky above Belgrade, that are the sunsets. In autumn and in summer, they are broad and bright like desert mirages, and in winter they are smothered by murky clouds and dark red hazes. And in every time of year frequently come the days when the flame of that sun setting in the plain, between the rivers beneath Belgrade, gets reflected way up in the high celestial dome, and it breaks there and pours down over the scattered town. Then, for a moment, the reddish tint of the sun paints even the remotest corners of Belgrade and reflects into the windows, even of those houses it otherwise poorly illuminates."

Belgrade, a city of very tumultuous history, is one of the oldest cities in Europe. Its history lasts full 7,000 years. The area around two great rivers, the Sava and the Danube has been inhabited as early as palaeolithic period. Remains of human bones and skulls of Neanderthals, found in the stone-pit near Leštane, in a cave in Čukarica and near the Bajloni market, date back to the early Stone Age.

Remains of the late Stone Age culture have been found in Vinča, Žarkovo and in Upper Town, above the Sava and Dunav confluence. It indicates that the area of Belgrade has been continually inhabited and that the intensity of the settling has been getting higher and higher. Many of today's settlements in Belgrade surroundings lie on cultural layers of earlier prehistoric settlements.



Vinča near Belgrade comes among the most important settlements and cultural sites of the prehistoric period. The presence of Illyrians is characteristic for the Bronze Age. The archaeological excavations at Rospi Ćuprija, Upper Town, Karaburma, Zemun and Vinča confirm hypotheses that the Belgrade area has been intensively inhabited and that its population has been engaged in plough agriculture and other supporting economic activities. Necropolises of the Bronze and Metal Ages as well as the evidence of different cultural influences have been discovered at these locations.

Belgrade is the centre of culture and art of Serbia. It is Belgrade where our most notable artists create, where over 11.000 theatrical performances, exhibitions, concerts, performance events, and other artistic programs are presented and where prominent authors in the world of art are hosted. Belgrade is the centre of the highest state and national institutions of culture and art: Serbian Academy of Arts and Sciences, the National Library of Serbia, the National Museum, the National Theatre and the University of Arts.



It is Belgrade where the most significant works of architecture are located, with Kalemegdan accommodating Belgrade Fortress, cultural monuments and other immovable cultural treasures, numerous archeological sites with remnants of developed civilization and culture on Belgrade territory from prehistory until this day.

The City of Belgrade is the founder of 30 cultural institutions (12 theatres, 8 institutions for protection of cultural values, 4 libraries, 6 cultural centers and galleries) and at the same time contribute in the implementation of schedules and scheduled attractions of institutions and artistic associations.

ELIGIBILITY:

They have only teams and individuals duly registered in KFS for 2025/26 year of participants, or duly registered members of the organization that is in the WKF system

DOCUMENTS:

For athletes and officials national accreditation, ID or passport, and for all competitors, domestic and foreign, a valid medical insurance.

SPORTS AND PROTECTIVE

EQUIPMENT:

in accordance with the Kata and Kumite Competition Rules for athletes, coaches, referees and managers.

ACCESSIBILITY:

Next to the tatamis on the floor can be found only coaches and managers in sports equipment with visibly displayed valid accreditation.

NOTES:

- Officials at the competitions are required to have provided documents and to give them the insight to delegate.
- In case of lack or insufficiency of documents to competitors and officials will not be allowed to participate in the competition.
- Each club is responsible for the health of their competitors and competitor takes on the responsibility of clubs. The competition organizer is not liable for any injuries of athletes.
- A competitor in the individual competition can occur only in her age.
- In the application form for the kata teams it is necessary to specify the names of athletes who are part of teams.

6. Team kata consists of three competitors and the team can be mixed in age category - children.
7. In kata team for cadets and juniors and U21 all team members must be from the prescribed age groups , the younger may not work for the elderly.
8. In age category children competition in katas is conducted in six classes: class E (yellow belt), class D (orange belt), class C (green belt), class B (blue belt), class A (brown belt) and Open categories.
9. Competitors perform a katas from WKF and KFS kata list.
10. Children from class E and D (yellow and orange belts) perform katas T1-2-3 and H 1-2-3-4-5 and can be repeated every third round (must know at least two kata) and an kata can not be repeated consecutively.
11. Children in class C (green belts), perform katas H 1-2-3-4-5 and teki katas and can be repeated every 4 round (must know at least three kata) and an kata can not be repeated consecutively.
12. Children in class B (blue belt), performed katas H 1-2-3-4-5, teki katas and tokui katas, in each round new kata, but in match for a medal repeatable kata from elimination, but not consecutively.
13. Children in class A (brown belt), perform tokui katas, in each round of new kata, but in match for a medal repeatable kata from elimination, but not consecutively.
14. Competitors in the open category in age category 2015, 2014, 2013 and 2012 perform katas from Official Kata List, in each round of new kata. For age categories 2017 and 2016 competitors perform katas from Official Kata List and can be repeated every fourth round (must know at least three katas) and an kata can not be repeated consecutively.
15. Cadets class C (yellow and orange belts) perform katas T1-2-3 and H 1-2-3-4-5 and can be repeated every third round (must know at least two kata) and an kata can not be repeated consecutively. Cadets class B (green and blue belt) performed katas H 1-2-3-4-5, teki katas and tokui katas, in each round new kata, but in match for a medal repeatable kata from elimination, but not consecutively. Cadets class A (brown belt), perform tokui katas, in each round of new kata, but in match for a medal repeatable kata from elimination, but not consecutively.
16. With team kata competitors perform katas from Official Kata List. Kata teams in age category 2017 and 2016 can be repeated every third round (must know at least two katas) and an kata can not be repeated consecutively. Kata teams in age category 2015 and 2014 can be repeated every fourth round (must know at least three katas) and an kata can not be repeated consecutively. Kata teams in age category 2013 and 2012 perform katas in each round of new kata but in match for a medal repeatable kata from elimination, but not consecutively.
17. In competition in kata individual for children both competitors (red and blue) are perform katas simultaneously, after which the referees declared the winner.
18. In team kata for children one member of the team can be the first younger age groups.
19. In kata team for cadets/juniors male and female, for U21 male and U21 female and seniors male and female will perform the bunkai only in the finals metchs.
20. In kumite team all members must be from the prescribed age groups, the younger may not work for the elderly.
21. Competition for children is conducted by the cup system without repasage.
22. Competition for cadets, juniors, U21 and seniors are conducted by the cup system with shortened repasage (one match in the repasage).
23. The kumite for U21 femala and male, seniors male and female last three minutes, for juniors male and female and cadets male and female the kumite lasts two minutes, while the kumite for male and female children lasts 90 seconds.
24. The organizer will not bear any responsibility (the schedule, the lack of required documentation or protective equipment), and to produce effects (no performance athletes, injury, etc.). In such cases clubs have a responsibility.
25. Next to the competition area can be found only coaches and managers in sports equipment with visibly displaying a valid accreditation.
